

Spanish Eyelets

Spanish eyelets is a finger manipulated technique which produces small holes – eyelets. The weft goes back and forth an odd number of times under a small group of warp threads and then moves to the next group, as shown in the sample below. The weft may be pulled and distort the fabric, especially if the number of shots per group is greater than three.



The sample above shows the weft the same size as the warp. A larger size can be used as shown in the sample below.



With the larger yarn, the back and forth weft is more obvious, but the eyelets disappear in favor of a textured look. The fabric distortion can be substantial in this case.
