


Spot Bronson

Unlike the Huck family, Spot Bronson does not share threading with Lace Bronson. It is a unit or

group thread weave with three blocks; warp or weft floats can be woven on any block, while the other two weave plain weave and the alternate float appears on the other side of the fabric. The extra block comes at the expense of plain weave: it can be woven across the fabric, but not down the length, so floating selvages are needed. See drawdown on the left.

As in Lace Bronson, every other end is threaded on shaft 1, so the heddle count must be checked before starting.



In the fabric below, the three blocks are arranged in a diamond; the draft is on its right.
