

Steep Twill

This is a way of treadling a twill to change the angle of the line. I learned about this twill in the

LeClerc Master Weaver series where there are several options.

The draft of the example on the left, with the fabric below, is one where the weft floats change size as well as the angle. There are three repeats of the treadling.

A skeleton tie up is used because of the many treadles needed to weave this twill. It's a bit cumbersome, but with an interesting look, reminiscent of an undulating twill (see entry).
